

Motion for Relief from Stay Regarding the Debtor's Principal Residence and related Affidavit

Pursuant to L.B.R 4001-1(e) (2), the Motion for Relief from Stay and Affidavit events have been modified. Upon docketing a Motion for Relief from Stay [Bankruptcy > Motions/Applications > Motion for relief from stay], the event prompts the filer to indicate if the request for relief is regarding the debtor's principal residence (see Figure 1).




Is this motion regarding a security interest in the Debtors principal residence?

If the filer selects “Yes” in response to this question, the event notifies the filer they must serve an affidavit in support of the motion within 7 days and establishes the deadline (see Figure 2).



When a filer docketes an Affidavit [Miscellaneous > Affidavit], the event prompts the filer to indicate if the Affidavit is in reference to a Motion for Relief from Stay regarding principal residence (see Figure 3).
