ECF Changes & Updates

Withdrawal

The withdrawal events [Bankruptcy > Miscellaneous > Withdrawal] and [Adversary > Miscellaneous > Withdrawal] have been modified. Upon docketing a notice of Withdrawal, filers are able to select the document(s) being withdrawn from an expanded list of documents.

Order Granting Debtor's Request for Permanent Exemption from Credit Counseling

A Form Order Granting Debtor's Request for Permanent Exemption from Credit Counseling has been modified. The order contains a reminder of the debtor(s) requirement to file Official Form B23 even if the debtor(s) have been granted exemption under 11 U.S.C. § 109(h) (4).

First Day Motions

The First Day Motions [Bankruptcy > Motions/Applications > First Day Motions] event has been modified. Upon docketing a First Day motion, a selection list has been modified to match the message and prompt that reminds filers to use the correct event (see Figures 1 & 2).

Motion to Reopen Case

The following motions to reopen events have been modified:

- Motion to Reopen Chapter 7 Case [Bankruptcy > Motions/Applications > Motion to Reopen Case (7)];
- Motion to Reopen Chapter 9 Case [Bankruptcy > Motions/Applications > Motion to Reopen Case (9)];
- Motion to Reopen Chapter 11 Case [Bankruptcy > Motions/Applications > Motion to Reopen Case (11)];
- Motion to Reopen Chapter 12 Case [Bankruptcy > Motions/Applications > Motion to Reopen Case (12)];
- Motion to Reopen Chapter 13 Case [Bankruptcy > Motions/Applications > Motion to Reopen Case (13)]; and
- Motion to Reopen Chapter 15 Case [Bankruptcy > Motions/Applications > Motion to Reopen Case (15)].

If a motion to reopen a case is filed *and* the event selected is inconsistent with the chapter of the case, you are unable to proceed (see Figure 3).
